Friday, May 10, 2013: Talk: Greed: Hunger's Agony

Jungian Analyst Mary Burke will focus on the archetypal foundation of greed, a difficult and often disturbing aspect of our human nature which impacts us both personally and as a society. She will use the myth "Erysichthon" from *Tales from Ovid* as an example. Through story and images, she will explore greed's nature and the consequences of being caught in its power. You will recognize Erysichthon as a remarkably modern figure. Learning about the forces that drive his character will give us a deeper understanding of greed.

Saturday, May 11, 2013: Workshop

The workshop will continue exploring the archetypal themes of hunger and greed from a personal perspective. What are our hungers? How do we try to satisfy them? What is the cost? We may be surprised to discover where greed underlies our lives.
