For thousands of years, the labyrinth symbol has been an archetype that appears in many different forms and in many different cultures. The use of the labyrinth symbol has evolved significantly over time. This presentation will explore the origin of labyrinth designs, their incorporation into religious practices, and their current use by modern people in hospitals, schools, prisons, spas, city parks, and mental health facilities. This discussion of labyrinth history and practice will focus on Jungian concepts such as differentiation, psychological complexes, the Self, the shadow, and the transcendent function.

Learning Objectives:

1. Participants will learn the cultural history and mythology of four major labyrinth designs
2. Participants will learn modern uses of these designs
3. Participants will learn to install a Cretan labyrinth design from masking tape
4. Participants will walk the labyrinth together and process their experiences

G. Jung Library for Southern Arizona Friends of Jung.
